PSCI Graduate Student Wins 2nd Prize at BCLA Entrepreneurship Summit 2016



Rising 3rd year PSCI student **Jordan Despanie** (Andrew MacKay lab), earned 2nd prize in this year's Biotech Connection Los Angeles (BCLA) 2nd annual **Entrepreneurship Summit : Innovation and the Path To Market** at CNSI/UCLA on June 11th. Jordan's innovative idea is to develop a novel therapeutic for the treatment of hemorrhagic shock (e.g. battlefield wounds, civilian emergencies) by generating a hemoglobin-based oxygen carrier nanomedicine. Jordan and his PI, Dr Mackay, have set up a biotech startup company SAIMA Biopharmaceuticals (visit the website at <http://www.saimabio.com/>). 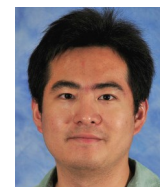
